About This Summary

This summary has been prepared by the Birch Carbon Program to help Indigenous Nations understand the benefits that a greenhouse gas offset project may bring to a community, beyond the carbon itself.

Rather than replacing the original Government of Canada publication, this document sets out the three families of benefit it describes, explains what each one can look like on the ground, and connects them to Indigenous-led stewardship.

THE STARTING POINT

Why This Matters

A carbon project is often described only in terms of credits and tonnes. That is the smallest part of the story.

The Government of Canada groups the benefits of an offset project into three families: economic, environmental, and social. Each one touches a different part of community life, and for many Nations the social and environmental benefits matter as much as the revenue.

THE QUESTION WORTH ASKING

Not only what a project earns, but what it protects, what it employs, and what it leaves behind for the next generation.

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KEY CONCEPTS EXPLAINED



CONCEPT 01

Three Families of Benefit

Economic

Revenue from the sale of offset credits, and employment tied to caring for the land.

Environmental

Healthier habitat, soil, water and forest, alongside the climate benefit itself.

Social

Support for cultural and traditional use, community health, and new skills held locally.

WHY IT MATTERS TO INDIGENOUS NATIONS

These are not competing outcomes. A well-designed project tends to produce all three at once, because they come from the same act of stewardship.

CONCEPT 02

Economic Benefits

Taking part in an offset project is an economic development opportunity. The sale of offset credits creates a revenue stream that can help fund community priorities, decided by the community.

Projects in sectors such as **forestry, agriculture and waste management** can also present employment opportunities.

WHY IT MATTERS TO INDIGENOUS NATIONS

Where employment has been tied to natural resource development, offset projects may be able to offer work of a different kind: jobs in better management of the land and in reducing carbon pollution, rather than in extraction.

CONCEPT 03

Environmental Benefits

Offset projects are a way to earn revenue from activities that reduce climate change rather than contribute to it.

Projects that improve land management practices may also deliver co-benefits well beyond carbon:

- Improved wildlife habitat

- Better soil quality

- Better water quality

- Conservation of forest

WHY IT MATTERS TO INDIGENOUS NATIONS

These co-benefits are often the outcomes a Nation cared about first. Carbon markets simply provide a way to fund the work that produces them.

CONCEPT 04

Social and Cultural Benefits

- Land-based projects can improve wildlife and plant populations for cultural and traditional use, supporting activities such as **hunting and harvesting**
- Waste management projects can reduce the risks of harmful pollutants and improve community well-being and health
- Project development can build community capacity through new skills and knowledge that stay in the community

WHY IT MATTERS TO INDIGENOUS NATIONS

Capacity is the benefit that outlasts the project. Skills in monitoring, mapping, and land management remain with the Nation whatever happens in the market.

CONCEPT 05

Benefits Are Not Automatic

Benefits follow the project, and not every project qualifies. What a Nation may see depends on:

- The type of project and whether an approved protocol exists for it
- Whether the project meets eligibility rules and passes independent verification
- How many credits the project generates, and what buyers pay for them

SAID PLAINLY

Early figures are planning tools, not promises. They are there to help a community decide whether the next step is worth taking.

OUR PERSPECTIVE

The revenue is real. It is also the smallest part.

The Nations we work with rarely lead with the money.

They ask whether the moose will come back. Whether the water will run clean. Whether young people will have a reason to stay, and work worth doing when they do.

Those are the benefits this publication describes, and they are the ones we think are worth measuring.

ALWAYS IN A GOOD WAY

A project that pays well but leaves the land poorer has failed, whatever the credits say.

OUR ROLE

How the Birch Carbon Program Supports Communities

We work alongside Indigenous Nations throughout project development. Our role includes:

- Identifying which benefits a territory may realistically support
- Explaining technical requirements in plain language
- Coordinating scientific assessment and quantification
- Supporting project registration and independent verification
- Connecting verified credits with qualified buyers
- Helping communities decide, at every stage

OUR GOAL

To simplify a complex process while supporting Indigenous-led stewardship, informed decision-making, and long-term sustainability.

NEXT STEPS

Where a Nation Can Begin

There is no obligation at any stage, and no land use changes while questions are still being answered.

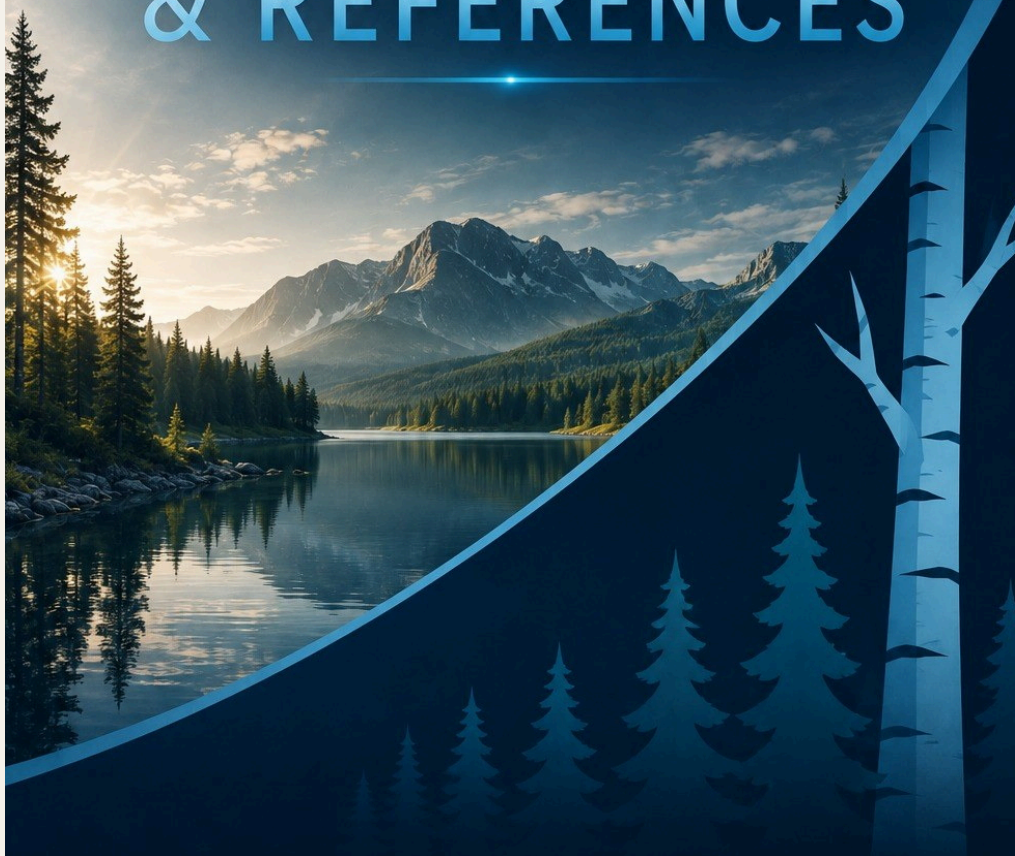
- **Name the benefits that matter.** Revenue, habitat, employment, capacity. Communities weigh them differently, and that shapes the project.
- **Talk it through.** We can meet with Chief and Council, staff, or community members and answer questions in plain language.
- **Look at the land.** A preliminary review helps identify which benefits a territory may realistically support.
- **Decide together.** Any next step is the Nation's decision, on the Nation's timeline.
